The Existing (old) system continues to be operational as last tested - (02-27-08).

Additional Information

Indian Point Unit 2 is in the eighth day (8) of the planned refueling outage.

The unit is shutdown. Operations crews have removed the reactor vessel head assembly in preparation for lifting the head package off the reactor and have flooding the reactor cavity.

The 95-foot containment equipment hatch is open and crews are bringing materials into containment for maintenance on various pumps, valves and piping.

Unit 2 had been online for 298 days and was operating at 94 percent power when the shutdown occurred. The unit was in a reduced power or coasted down in preparation for a scheduled refueling shutdown on Wednesday. The repair crews will examine the pump and make the necessary repairs during the outage.

Cycle 18, which included the 298-day run for IP2, was the most productive in the unit's history.

During the outage 88 of the 193 fuel assemblies will be replaced, the reactor vessel head will be inspected and various tests and surveillances will be performed.

Unit 3 is operating at 100 percent reactor power and has been on line for 334 days.

This is a New York State FIREFIGHTER ASSIST AND SEARCH TEAM (FAST) course. A firefighter as a member of a FAST operation will identify the tools and staffing requirements for a FAST operation, develop a rescue plan for a missing, lost or trapped firefighter; demonstrate rope search techniques and demonstrate removing a firefighter/victim up a stairwell, up or down through a hole in a floor/roof, moving a downed firefighter out of a window and lowering a firefighter down a ladder. This course requires students to perform a number of practical evolutions with self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA).

Based on Chief John Salka's "Get Out Alive" program, this program is designed for self-rescue and rescue of trapped firefighters. Course content will enable firefighters to recognize the types of events encountered on the fire ground that contribute to firefighter disorientation or entrapment, to have knowledge of what is necessary to ensure their safety and that of partners or crew members and perform self-rescue techniques when disoriented, separated when needing to exit a structure in an emergency. This course is identical to residential course 2587
