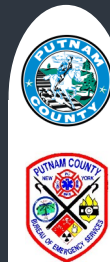

READY—TO—GO CHECKLIST FOR PETS

Putnam County Mass Care - Evacuation Shelters do not accept pets due to health conditions.

You must plan ahead for an emergency that requires bringing your pets:

- Contact family or friends outside your area to see if they will house you and your pets in an emergency
- Make a list of veterinary offices or boarding facilities that might be able to shelter your pets
- Contact hotels and motels outside your area to see if they would allow pets in an emergency
- Provide your pet's caregiver a permission slip — giving them authority to provide essential care for your pet
- Have a PET Go-Kit with their food, records, medicine & toys ready to go with your family emergency kit

A disaster or evacuation may occur at anytime, even when you are at work or not home. Plan with your neighbors, friends, or relatives to make sure someone is available to care for your pets if you are unable to do so.

The best way to protect yourself, your family, and your animals in the event of an emergency is to have a plan.

If an emergency forces you to evacuate your home, try not to leave your pets behind. Animals most likely will not be able to survive on their own. Even if you try to create a safe place for them, they are likely to be injured, lost, or worse — die.

Do not wait until the last minute. Prepare now by assembling a "ready to go" pet kit and have a plan.

- Food , enough for 3 days
- Water, enough for 3 days
- Pet medications
- Pet first aid kit
- ID tags
- Harness or leash
- Muzzle –if needed
- Adoption papers, vaccination documents that include pet's name
- Crate or pet carrier
- Pet litter, paper towels, plastic bags ,and bleach
- Picture of you and your pet together
- Familiar items (favorite toys, bedding, treats)
